He also could not ascertain where the match was played. Richard Miller has discovered the above and it is taken from the *Swindon Advertiser and North Wiltshire Chronicle* August 1 1885.] Which side went in first was not stated.

A double tie match. Which side went in first was not stated. The full score could not be obtained [by Haygarth and it is taken from the *Carlisle Patriot* July 3 1885 and supplied by Mick Pope] or it would have been inserted. In another account the second innings of each side was stated to be 57, and these discrepancies are marvellous and puzzling.

At Grey Towers Park, Hornchurch, August 27, 1885

A match was played at the above place and date between J. Wiffen's Eleven of the Fox and Hounds at Romford and the eleven of Mr. T. Wilson of Hornchurch with the following result.

The full score could not be procured for insertion. It is curious too that the innings of each should be exactly the same.

[A double tie match does not occur very often, but it is curious to note that this was the fourth such result recorded in 1885. The others were at Carlisle July 1 (see p. 266), Broad Town July 25 (see p. 374), and Tenby August 10 (see p. 464). All are recorded in these pages.]

A (quadruple) tie match.

Which side went in first was (unfortunately) not stated. This inferior match is inserted as a great curiosity, the totals of all the four innings being exactly the same. In another account of this match in the second innings of the Royal Munster Fusiliers, R. Boyle is not out 2; J. Chadwick is b Garner 4; and Capt. Boyton is not out 0. It is presumed however that the above is correct. One man it will be observed was absent in the second innings of Tenby. [Johnston was put Johnson in the MS. The full score was published in *James Lillywhite's Cricketers' Annual for 1886* pp. 260-1.]

The only parallel case previous to the above was that played between Woking at Shiere when the four innings were 71 and 71; and 71 and 71, on August 22, 1818. [See Volume I p. 416 which only shows a potted score. This match was actually played August 21 which is confirmed in the *Windsor and Eton Express and Reading Journal* August 23 1818, *Hampshire Chronicle* August 31 1818, and *Morning Advertiser* August 31 1818. These newspapers put Gentlemen of Woking v Shiere and stated that the former went in first. Shiere is the original spelling of what is now Shere in Surrey.]
